## Final KBC 3.0 Leadership thru Sports Workshop delivered

The final Kadam Badhate Chalo (KBC) 3.0 Leadership through Sports workshop was held for 30 youth (60% female) in Hyderabad on the  $8^{th} \& 9^{th}$  of February 2019, with the support of local partners Rubaroo.



The workshop was received with lots of enthusiasm, as the participants built on their leadership and facilitation skills. This was the last workshop part of KBC 3.0, being implemented in collaboration with Martha Farrell Foundation and PRIA, with the program culminating in a national youth leadership forum in March 2019.

#### <u>3rd Training Workshop delivered</u> to Youth Leaders in Odisha

The third workshop part of a training program for rural youth leaders in Odisha was held from the 16<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> of February 2019 in Malkangiri, in collaboration with Centre for Youth & Social Development (CYSD).



The workshop, attended by 14 youth (43% female), built on their facilitation skills, with a focus on warm-up and cool down techniques, long-term and short-term planning as well as overcoming challenges in program delivery.

### Mixed-Gender Kho-Kho Competition held in BSBR

PSD organized the first ever mixed-gender Kho-Kho tournament in Bhubaneswar on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2019 as part of the Community Sports Program (CSP), in collaboration with Tata Trusts.



The tournament was held in Beena Bharati Vidya Mandira school in Bharatpur. Ten teams comprising a total of 118 children (49% girls) from four schools part of the CSP took part in the tournament. Each team comprised of about 12 players, with half girls and half boys. Each team fielded nine playing members per match, with at least four of them being girls.



The final saw teams from Saraswati Shishu Mandira (Bharatpur) and Saraswati Shishu Vidya Mandir (Patrapada) compete in front of a packed crowd, with the former emerging victorious.
