

### KBC Gender through Sports Workshop held in Raipur

The Kadam Badhate Chalo 2.0 program, in partnership with MFF (Martha Farrell Foundation) and PRIA (Participatory Research in Asia), moved to Raipur, Chhattisgarh, where the Gender through Sports workshop was held on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of October, 2017.



This workshop saw the participation of 56 youth (35 F; 21 M) who had self-nominated themselves following the Freedom to Play sports camps held in Raipur in September by local partners PRIA-Raipur, where a total of 162 youth participated.



17-year old participant Ranjana Mirza described her experience of participating in the workshop, "It was a completely different experience, talking to everyone about how we feel. I felt both surprised and happy when the boys were supporting us and talking about women's rights."

### Sports Kits Distributed to All Participants of CSP



As part of the Community Sports Program, supported by Tata Trusts, PSD has distributed sports kits (t-shirts & shorts) to all 618 participating children across 7 centres. This has ensured that they are now wearing these kits for all their sports sessions; already their body language has improved and their energy and enthusiasm during sessions is higher.

### Training Workshops Conducted for ASA Coaches in Anantapur

Training workshops were conducted by PSD for a total of 115 Anantapur Sports Academy (ASA) coaches from the 13<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> of October, 2017 in Anantapur, Andhra Pradesh.



Two different 1-day workshops were conducted for various sports coaches of ASA, each delivered in two separate batches. The first was a fun games training workshop. This provided coaches with the requisite skills and knowledge to deliver fun games to participating children, with a focus on improving their Fundamental Movement Skill and imbibing various sporting values.



The other was a gender training workshop, delivered in partnership with Martha Farrell Foundation. This helped coaches to deliberate and understand gender specific issues, especially within their programs/ centres, through various engaging activities. M. Anjali Devi, a young football coach at Kalyandurg in Anantapur district, said of her participation in the fun games training, "The workshop was important as it is a good tool for the coaches to use for team building and confidence for both girls and boys."
