

### Training Workshop held for Teachers part of CSP Schools

**"Through hard work, study and practice I can achieve anything": Divyesh's story**

Bhubaneswar, Odisha, May 2018

In its first year at Saraswati Sishu Vidya Mandir (SSVM) school, Pro Sport Development's (PSD) Community Sports Program (CSP) has helped transform a shy, inactive boy into an energetic, confident leader in his class and in his school. 13-year-old Divyesh Das lives in Kalinga Vilas with his father and mother and, like many of his peers, cycles to SSVM school every day.

PSD coach Bhaktanandan Swain observes that there has been a significant change in Divyesh since the start of the CSP, which

### CSP Programs re-started in BBSR after Summer Break

PSD's Community Sports Programs (CSP) have restarted after the summer break. The CSP supported by Tata Trusts resumed in full flow in the 7 schools, despite the wet weather in July.



The Fundamental Movement Skills program for children between 4-10 years of age, part of the CSP, was initiated in 5 schools in July, with the distribution of sports equipment, sports bibs and First Aid kits, provided by Ebaco India.



### Gender My Way Workshop held in Deoghar part of KBC 3.0

As part of Kadam Badhate Chalo (KBC) 3.0, in collaboration with PRIA (Participatory Research in Asia) and MFF (Martha Farrell Foundation), PSD conducted the first Understanding Gender My Way (UGW) workshop in Deoghar, Jharkhand. The workshop, which saw the participation of 48 youth (63% girls), was held from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2018 in partnership with local partners Fontal Development Foundation.



The UGW workshop incorporates several sport-based activities, which help in getting girls and boys comfortable working, communicating and interacting with each other, while also helping them understand and tackle gender-based stereotypes in their daily lives.



### PSD Supports Mayurbhanj Football League 2018

PSD continued its long-term support to the Mayurbhanj Football League (MFL), a unique initiative that brings together tribal football teams from northern districts of Odisha to participate in a Football festival organized in Kanpur village in Mayurbhanj District.



The 2018 edition of MFL saw the participation of 16 teams and more than 200 participants over 2 days on 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> June, 2018, with close to 7,000 spectators in attendance!
