

PSD Collaborates with Kadam Badhate Chalo Campaign

Kadam Badhate Chalo (KBC) is a youth-driven campaign implemented by the Society for Participatory Research in Asia (PRIA) and the Martha Farrell Foundation (MFF). KBC motivates youth, both male and female, to strategise and implement a campaign to address violence against women and gender discrimination in Indian society.

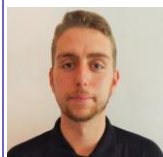


PSD partnered with PRIA and MFF to deliver sports workshops within the KBC framework, at the Jaipur program. In its initial phase, the KBC campaign in Jaipur empowered youth to implement a safety audit in their communities. The workshops with these youth were implemented in the areas designated as unsafe in their communities, subtly questioning gender stereotypes, especially prevalent through sport in India, and challenging the perceptions of violence in these unsafe areas.



The camp was conducted over 4 days, covering a total of 5 wards in Jaipur city, with a total of 215 youth (85 girls and 130 boys).

PSD implemented a short training program with the 12 FMA teachers to help them understand the concepts of our community sports program, and teach them how to conduct mini educational games to help their children learn the values of leadership, communication and teamwork.
